COVID-19 Pool Operation Prevention Plan (CPOPP)

Staffing and Pool Facility Operations

- COVID contact person will be the pool manager
- Pool Director/Managers, lifeguards and staff will be trained on COVID-19 awareness, cleaning and sanitizing procedures to perform their assigned duties in a manner that promotes the safety of public and staff.
- Staff training in exposure and avoidance of Covid-19 exposure will take place throughout the summer.
- COVID awareness training and risk reduction strategies for all pool staff will be documented.
- Temperature readings of staff entering the facility will be taken daily. Persons that have a fever of 100.4° or above or other signs of COVID-19 illness will not be admitted to the facilities and will be sent home. They are to remain home until it is determined it is safe for them to return to work.
- All staff will be required to clock in and out of work to facilitate potential contact tracing efforts.
- Staff will have storage space for belongings in the game room to maintain 6 ft. of social distancing.
- All lifeguards are encouraged to wear a mask when not on their lifeguarding shift. All Pool Staff are encouraged to wear a mask when 6 feet of social distancing cannot be maintained.
- All staff should wash hands or use hand sanitizer after coming in physical contact with a member or co-worker.
- All Lifeguards should sanitize the guard chairs after each shift. Wipes and/or sanitizer will be provided at each guard chair daily.
- Lifeguards will be provided with their own rescue tube while on duty and will be responsible to sanitize before the next use.
- Lifeguards do not need to wear masks when on the lifeguard chairs.
- Lifeguards must not wear masks in the pool.
- All Lifeguards will be provided with their own personal rescue mask. (CPR) These masks should be kept with them at all times while on duty.

- Designated pool staff will sanitize chairs, tables, gates, umbrellas, railings, poles, etc. throughout the day. Gloves and masks should be worn.
- Masks and gloves should be worn at all times while providing first aid.

Admittance and Access to the Facility

- Members will access the facility through the main entryway on the left side of the partition keeping 6 ft. social distance as indicated with floor markings and exit on the opposite side of the partition. Entry and exit will be staggered.
- Signage in accordance with the New Jersey Department of Health and CDC guidelines is posted at the entrance.
- A cash-less option will be offered at the entrance and snack bar when purchasing memberships, guest passes and snack bar items.
- Members will be asked by the gate attendant to provide the names of all members in their party who will be recorded in the membership book for contact tracing purposes.
- Gate attendants will maintain social distance by sitting in the office behind the plexiglass window. Masks are required when interacting with Members.
- In accordance with the New Jersey Department of Health we will limit our occupancy by 50% as suggested. Capacity will not exceed the NJ Executive Order for outside gatherings - 250 people on June 22 and then 500 people on July 3.
- Lap swimming will not be allowed during normal hours until restrictions are further lifted unless deemed safe for social distancing to occur in the pool. Safe lap swimming times for adult swimmers may be provided beyond normal operation hours.
- COM Members will be permitted to bring guests after July 3rd, subject to capacity limits. Guests will be signed in at the gate for contact tracing purposes.
- Demarcated areas on pool deck will maintain social distancing
- Bather load will be calculated according to the Pool Surface area 28 sq. ft./person.
- Members are responsible for maintaining social distancing and sanitization whenever possible.

Infection Control Strategies

- The emergency care room will be located outside of the lifeguard office

underneath the pavilion.

- The emergency care space will be sanitized by cleaning staff using disinfectant approved by the CDC and documented.
- A sufficient number of hand sanitizers and soap will be provided throughout the pool area.
- A designated staff member will be assigned to the role of cleaning and sanitizing touchpoints, including lounge chairs, railings, umbrella poles, restrooms.
- Lounge chairs will be disinfected after every family leaves their designated numbered sitting space. Families will be encouraged not to share their furniture or pool equipment, except among immediate family members or caretakers.
- Designated areas will be left as open space for members to provide their own chairs.
- Members will be permitted to use their own water play equipment, including but not limited to goggles, snorkels, fins, kickboards, pool noodles and toys, however the pool facility will not provide such equipment.
- No accommodations will be made for lost items and they will be discarded at the end of the day.

Restrooms and Shower Access

- Members will be required to wear foot coverings in the restrooms and encouraged to wear foot coverings on pool decks.
- Restrooms will be limited to two members at one time.

Face Masks, Gloves, and Social Distancing Strategies

- All members are encouraged to socially distance themselves in the pool facility. It is encouraged by the New Jersey Department of Health and the CDC that members wear masks when in the pool facility and social distancing of 6 feet cannot be maintained, unless doing so would inhibit the individual's health. Masks are not to be worn in the water. Children under the age of 2 do not need to wear a mask. Sanitizer/Sanitizing stations will be provided at the pool entrance.
- Masks will be provided for all staff. It is recommended they get their own mask in order for it to fit comfortably.
- Masks and gloves will be required when serving members while in the snack

bar.

- The staff will be required to frequently wash their hands.
- All lounge chairs, tables and chairs will be separated by proper social distancing measures.
- Visible markings will be used to control crowd flow in areas where social distancing might be harder to maintain. The snack bar will have demarcations.
- Pool managers will monitor and encourage 6 ft. of social distancing of bathers on the pool deck. Masks are encouraged for members when 6 ft. of social distancing can not be maintained.

Food Services

- All staff that will be handling food will be required to wear gloves and a face covering when serving members.
- Members will be discouraged from congregating near snack bar and must stand in demarcated areas.
- All snack bar staff will wash their hands frequently.
- Hand Sanitizer will be located at the snack bar.
- Sliding plexiglass windows will provide a barrier between staff and members while also allowing enough space for food and drinks.
- Grills will be available to members but grilling utensils must be provided by the Member. Grill knobs and touchpoints will be sanitized between uses.
- Snack bar items will be limited to packaged goods, canned beverages and bottled water.

Emergency Evacuation Procedure

- In the event that the pool and immediately surrounding areas must be evacuated: All lifeguards should immediately clear the pool and the surrounding areas and direct all patrons toward the closest exit of the pool area. Designating multiple exit locations will help to ensure social distancing protocols. Lifeguards are to act under the manager's or acting manager's direction. Once all patrons have evacuated the immediate pool area, the pool manager or acting manager must make a quick sweep of the facility and then proceed to meet the lifeguards and patrons in one of the designated meeting spots. The pool manager or acting manager is to work in coordination with the responding rescue team. All lifeguards are to remain in a calm and professional manner and once safely in one of the designated meeting spots

should assess any and all injuries patrons may have incurred.
